

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



On 9th February 2004, while inaugurating one of the first of 20 Centres, the men had boycotted the function. They were unhappy that the women had conspired to send the girls to our schools.

Last year we wanted to organize a function to felicitate the 94 girls who had passed class V, 91 in first division. We wanted to host the function at a school auditorium in Alwar, like last year. To our surprise we got a request from Bandipura village, where we run 3 centres, to host the function at their cost. We agreed to this.

The function was well organized. I was moved by their hospitality. The entire cost was borne by the village community. They had collected money and grains. There was a regular Pandal. We sat in chairs while the children sat on a rug. They drank from matkas, but arranged mineral water for us. After the function, we sat on the floor and shared a wonderful meal, with the village elders.

The community feeling was infectious. They were visibly proud of their girls, and even though they could not afford to pay for their education, they had all contributed towards this event. The men and women, young and old were all together in this. The social transformation in four short years was dramatic and evident for any one to see. Education was the catalyst.

Cut to Diegueno Country school, California, November, 2008. The school conceived a unique project...identify a cause and raise funds for charity. They short listed 6 projects. The children selected I I MPACT ! What a wonderful connection between girls of the same age in two different worlds ! These girls from Diegueno will certainly grow up as more sensitive, humane and responsible women thanks to this initiative of the school.

This is what inspires us, ... we want to reach out to more and more children and villages. We are thankful to our donors for making this possible. Almost all of our donors have increased their commitments year on year, and almost none have left us. I I MPACT currently has over 8000 girls in 275 centres and intends to take this to 15,000 girls in 500 centres in the current year, with your support.

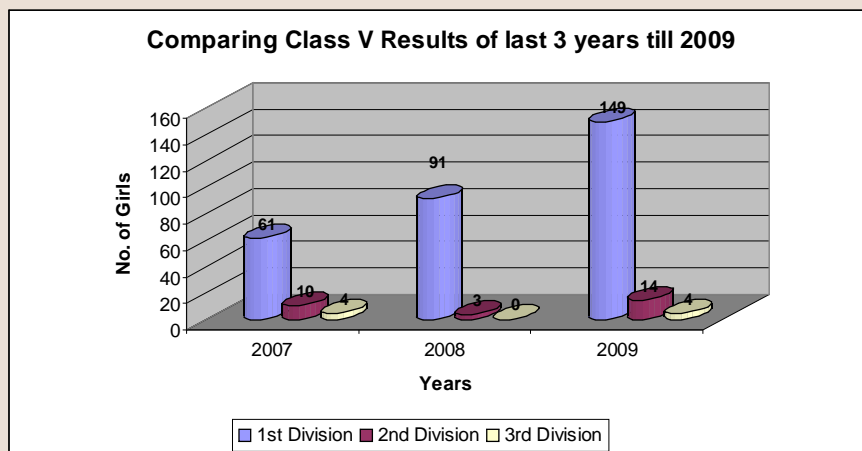
ACHIEVEMENTS

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2008-2009

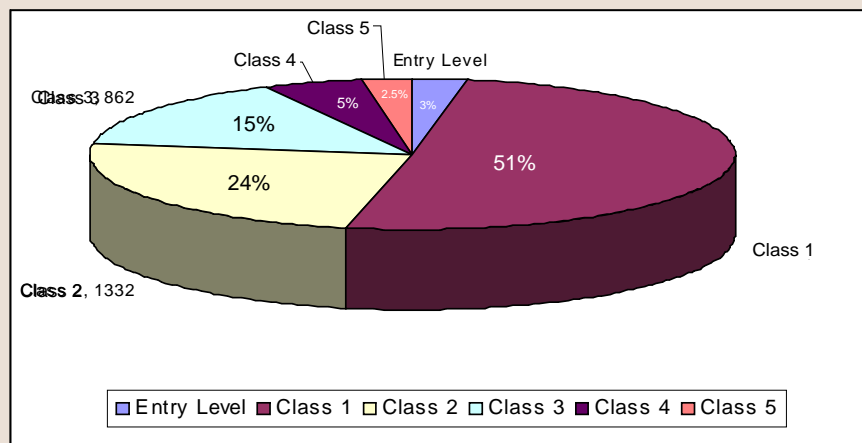
Each year some girls from IIMPACT centres prepare and appear for the class V local Government Board Examination before moving on to local secondary level schools. IIMPACT's non-formal, multilevel system of education enables girls to learn at their own pace, simultaneously preparing them well for these examinations.

This year's academic results were outstanding with yet again a 100% pass rate! Out of 167 girls :

149 secured a 1st division
14 secured a 2nd division
3 secured a 3rd division



DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS IN CLASSES



The above data includes 5637 girls of different age groups studying at different levels after their evaluation in the previous year. The girls belong to IIMPACT Learning Centers at Rajasthan and U.P.

The diagram clearly shows that there are 156 of girls are at entry level. Maximum number of girls are at Class 1 i.e. 51%-2858 girls then at Class 2 level-24%-1332 girls, Class 3 level 15%-862 girls, Class 4 level is 5% - 289 girls and Class 5 level is 2% - 140 girls.

OUR OPERATING MODEL

Our operating model involves working with partner NGOs who are familiar with the region in which our work is done and are in a position to overcome local sensitivities due to their past work in the same communities. Such NGO's normally work in community development or in the propagation of micro credit and Self Help Groups. It is not necessary for our partner NGOs to be in education, as this is where IIMPACT steps in. IIMPACT selects sites in highly disadvantaged areas, sets up schools, monitors their functioning, trains and re-trains teachers and helps garner funding so that more and more girl children have a chance to get educated. IIMPACT ensures that donor funds go directly, in their entirety, for running the schools, paying the teachers and for school supplies. The administration costs and overheads are NOT charged to donor accounts. These are borne entirely by the promoters themselves. IIMPACT provides management know-how and capacity building. IIMPACT partners with local NGOs and uses their services to develop a grass-roots organization for teaching.

IIMPACT monitors the performance of the girls and grades the education provided at every level. All along, objective criteria are used and regular reporting is done. We have a proven model consisting of learning centres, curriculum and teachers training. We screen local NGOs, establish our teaching modules and ensure successful implementation. With this model, our geographical reach extends over many districts in India.



OUR PARTNER NGOS

1. IBTADA

Ibtada is a non-government organisation which has done substantial work in empowering women through self help groups (SHGs) and in arranging micro credit in the Mewat region of Rajasthan. Today, more than 200 such SHGs have been formed. They associate with milk cooperatives, household savings and women's education among other awareness programs, especially towards education. Their link with mainstream banking system has now led these SHGs to avail of a vibrant saving-credit based micro finance channel. Ibtada's work with IIMPACT LCs is spread over 90 villages in two blocks in the Alwar district of Rajasthan.

2. NALANDA

Nalanda is an NGO which has conducted substantial work in educational innovation, teacher selection & training, curriculum development and monitoring basic education field projects. It has implemented several support assignments in primary education in Uttar Pradesh under Child Rights Project and Uttar Pradesh for Girls Education Programme, both projects of UNICEF. Nalanda also works as a technical consultant for the Bal Adhikar Pariyojna sponsored by UNICEF in the carpet belt of Uttar Pradesh. Nalanda's work with IIMPACT LCs is spread across 110 villages in Mahmoodabad block of Sitapur district of Uttar Pradesh.

3. PRERANA

Prerana is an organization committed to Rural Development for the last 19 years. The areas Prerana is associated with are education and child rights, women empowerment, village development, sustainable agriculture and rural health. Prerana, in collaboration with Reach India (Akshara Foundation, Bangalore)

has implemented its education improvement program initiative in villages in Raichur district. The objective was to ensure that every child is in school and is getting quality education. Prerana is also providing quality education through Child Activity Centres in collaboration with Every Child in several villages of Raichur district. Prerana also works towards women empowerment through co-operatives.

Prerana's girl child education programme with IIMPACT was inaugurated early last year and currently runs centres across 15 villages in Raichur district, Karnataka.

4. SARD (Society for All Round Development)

SARD is a non-profit organization aiming at increasing the participation of minorities and disadvantaged communities in mainstream development processes. SARD has worked in the region for over a decade promoting education, health and micro-finance. The issue of disabilities has also been dealt with by SARD within the village communities.

Mewat, a culturally contiguous region located 64 kms southwest of Delhi, is situated in and around the Aravali range of mountains. Access for education in Mewat has been a major problem, particularly for girls. The female literacy rate here ranges from 1.76% to 2.13%, is the lowest in the country. IIMPACT's girl child education program in collaboration with SARD in Mewat, Haryana was inaugurated in September 2008. Centres have already been established across 17 villages and are running successfully.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW

INTRODUCTION OF NEW HUBS

JHARKHAND

Determined to further expand our reach by developing additional 'spokes' and 'hubs' we identified Jharkhand which has amongst the lowest female literacy rates in the country. IIMPACT started 25 LCs for Tribal Girls in Jharkhand, near Ranchi, in June 2008. The project was initiated with the survey of 30-40 villages in the Bero Block, around 40 kilometers from Ranchi. The survey report gave a complete picture of out of school girls in the area. Based on the survey, 25 Learning Centers were approved to be established in 15 villages. Awareness was spread amongst prospective teachers in nearby colleges. The teacher selection was completed by the month of May 2008 and the centers were inaugurated in June 2008. Initially working in Ranchi ensued a number of challenges. The area is widely spread, so teachers had to travel 5-6 kms daily on an average. The local girls are involved in household and livelihood work, so their attendance was a major challenge. The teachers were very dedicated and they overcame all the hurdles with persistent efforts. Now they narrate stories of how they had almost given up on some girls, as they continuously neglected the Learning Centers, but were delighted when the same girls started coming to the centers regularly. The greatest success was tasted by a teacher who succeeded in stopping 15 girls from migrating to other city for work. These girls refused to go along with their parents for seasonal work so that they could stay back in the village and study in the IIMPACT Learning Centers.

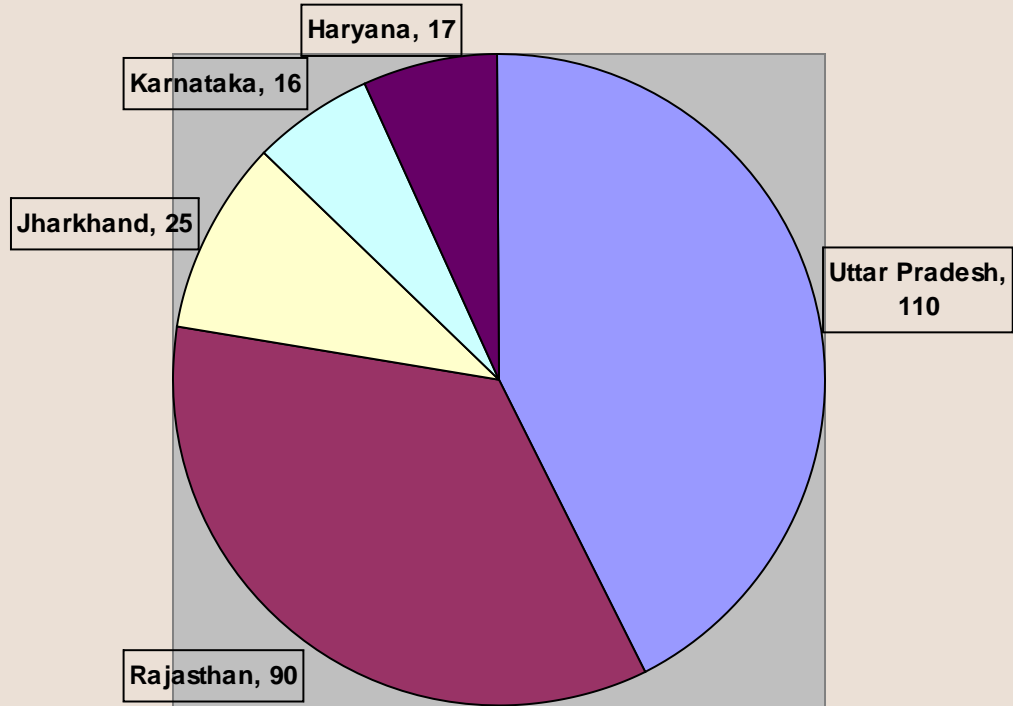
HARYANA

Another new area initiated in 2008 in District Mewat, in Haryana, added a new leaf to IIMPACT's work. Mewat is a mere 70 kms from the national capital, New Delhi, but it is the worst performing district on the development map of India. Mewat, which has majority Meo population (a backward caste), has just 2.3 percent female literacy. IIMPACT identified an NGO partner, SARD, to start IIMPACT learning centers in this district. Initially, Nuh block of the district was identified, but within a few months our work had spread to 2 more blocks, Tauru and Nagina. The survey in nearly 30 villages of Nuh was completed by August 2008. It was found that there was a very large number of out of school girls in each village selected for establishing the learning centers. Initially only 12 learning centers were started. Today 20 centers are running successfully covering 600 girls in this area. A majority of girls coming to our centers here are first generation learners of their families. Most of them were involved in household responsibilities and had no access to any kind of schooling. Today, each of these girls is showing remarkable progress as they recite poems in Hindi and English, solve mathematical problems, draw beautiful pictures and read with such fervor that even surprises us at times.

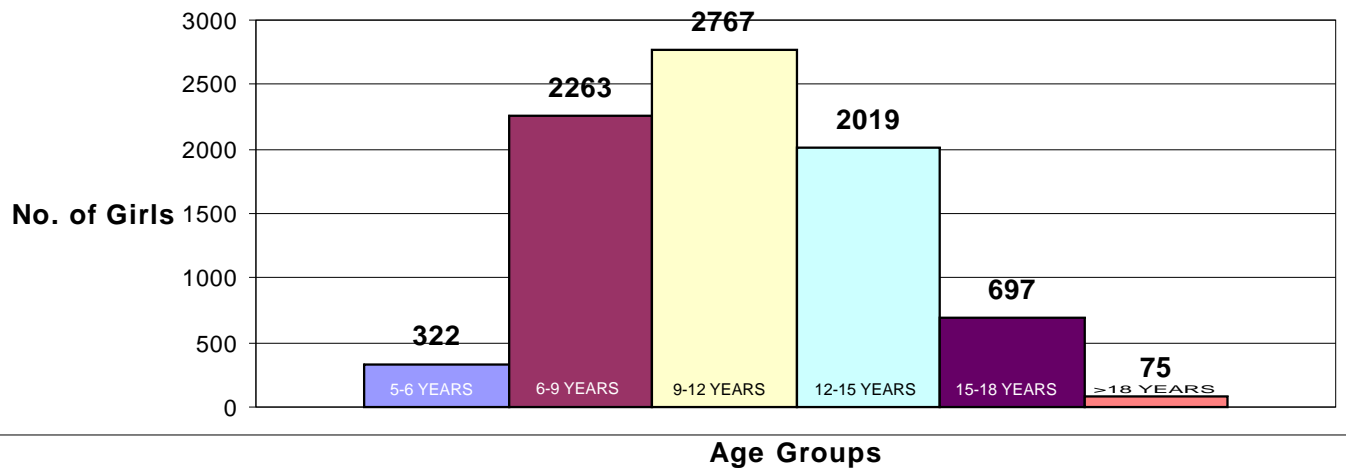


258 VILLAGES ARE COVERED BY IIMPACT IN 5 STATES

Uttar Pradesh Rajasthan Jharkhand Karnataka Haryana

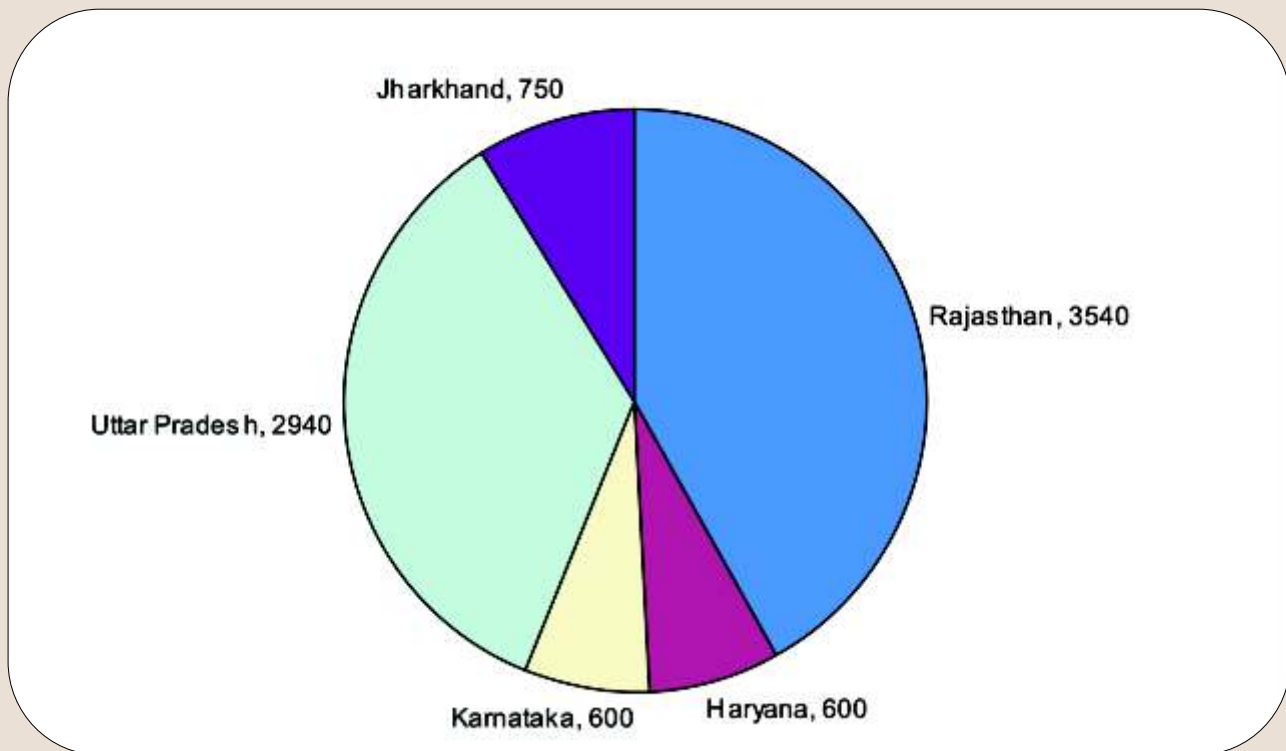


Age of girls at IIMPACT Learning Centers

FUTURE PLANS - THE ROAD AHEAD



Our vision is to grow to 2000 centres, imparting education to 60,000 girls by 2014. This would be equivalent to educating girls in an entire district in India. The daunting 2001 census figure of 52 million illiterate girls (7-14 years) in India makes all of us at IIMPACT even more determined to make our vision a reality. We have full confidence that we will continue to positively impact the lives of many more young girls, their families and of their village community as a whole.

ACTIVITIES

COMMUNITY INITIATIVE



CLASS ROOM CONSTRUCTION BY COMMUNITY

For the success of IIMPACT learning Centres participation of the community is of utmost importance. Many meetings take place between IIMPACT and the community members in order to strengthen this partnership.

The Dhaneta Learning Centre was facing a lack of space for a long time. The local community of Dhaneta found a remarkable way of overcoming this problem - they are constructing a separate classroom for the running of an IIMPACT Learning Centre on a piece of land donated by the village community members. The village community has in addition collected donations for the construction of the room in an innovative manner. Agricultural produce, in lieu of money, was collected from the villagers and construction material bought from the revenue earned from the sale of this produce in the market. The village community also arranged the labour for the construction of the structure.



CELEBRATIONS

IIMPACT Learning Centers not only impart education to the girls, they are also a hub for children to celebrate various national and cultural festivals. They now understand the meaning of Independence Day, Republic Day, Teachers Day, Childrens Day and other festivities in their lives. Children are encourage to celebrate Diwali, Holi, Eid and Christmas with equal fervor. The whole community comes together to celebrate the festivals of national importance. The children prepare relevant cultural performances/skits for these days. They also prepare speeches, sing patriotic songs, recite poems dance and drama for the occasion.

ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATIONS

This year's Annual Day celebrations took place in Mahmoodabad, an hour's drive from Lucknow on 16th November 2008. The theme of this program was 'Hamare Sapne', which translates to 'our dreams'. The event also served to commemorate Children's Day.

On this occasion staff from each of our hubs came together as family. IIMPACT's board members, donors and representatives from IIMPACT's partner NGO's from various parts of the country were greeted with garlands and tilak. Ms Manju Mithal from the Katherine and Kamal Agarwal Foundation and Mr Syed Sarfraz Ahmed from ING Vysya were our special guests for the day.

The common thread linking all the performances was the girls' desire to receive the benefits of education and to enjoy the same rights as their brothers. Their aspirations were depicted through songs, dances imaginative plays and fancy dress display. Awards and certificates Were also distributed to the girls and teachers on this special occasion.

EVENTS

ZERO LEVEL CAMP

A three-day camp was organized for children who are beginners or slow learners. A total of 51 children from 8 villages participated in this camp. This camp allowed teachers to work closely with these children enabling them to focus on their weak points. This helped the children come up to the academic level of their other classmates.

KISHORI MELA

The Kishori Mela, organized by IIMPACT in Raichur was held from 20th – 21st September, 2008 at the Sri Siddalingeshwar Temple in Manslapur. 56 children and a few parents participated in what proved to be an effective means of highlighting the importance of education, health and hygiene within the community.

PAN IIM GOLF TOURNAMENT - 2009

This annual golfing event took place on 1st March at the Golden Greens Golf Resort, 2009 Gaon where the participants were blessed with glorious golfing weather. Over 80 IIMITES from various parts of the country participated in this exciting event, some coming from as far as Mumbai, Lucknow, Kolkata and Bangalore.

IIMPACT presented each participant with a high quality golfing T. shirts (courtesy a donor). The IIMPACT team used this opportunity to increase awareness about the initiative and the importance of girl child education amongst the IIM Alumni gathered there. WORKSHOPS

WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS – EXPERIENCES SHARED



A sharing workshop was conducted at the Kishan Gadh office. The aim was to provide teachers with a platform to share their experiences and discuss challenges faced by them within the community. A total of 40 teachers participated and collectively helped find effective solutions to these problems, learning from each other's experiences.

INTRODUCTORY TRAINING WORKSHOP CONDUCTED BY IIMPACT STAFF

IIMPACT conducted an interactive workshop in Alwar on the use of low cost scientific experiments devised by Mr. Arvind Gupta (an IIT Kanpur alumnus). These will be introduced at all IIMPACT centres.

These experiments will go a long way in helping our girls develop an enquiring mind while making Science and Maths fun!

INSPIRING STORIES

A VISIBLE CHANGE



Mr Anil Kripalani, President TiE San Diego Group and his wife Vera visited centres sponsored by their group in Alwar, Rajasthan. They saw clear indications of changes taking place in the attitude of the local village community. The older menfolk of the village chose to be present during the above visit. It was made clear that strangers were not very welcome and that the shooting of photographs was an absolute taboo. They also appeared to be somewhat skeptical about education itself. Those present were updated on IIMPACT and on how it has managed to reach out to a large number of girls across the country. The positive outcome of IIMPACT's program was highlighted. It was reiterated that Learning Centres were set up for the benefit of their own community. Mrs Kripalani, who is an IIT alumnus then came forward to address the gathering. She spoke of her decision to pursue engineering, often considered a male domain. She attributed her success to the education that she had benefitted from. These words appeared to have an

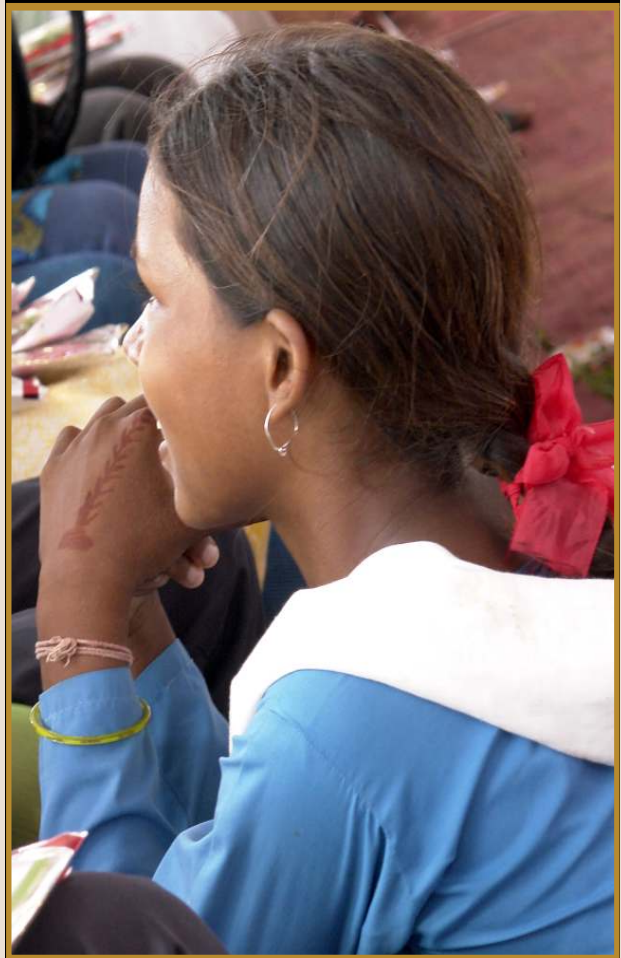


immediate impact on the community members. It was then that the village Pradhan came forward to say that he was extremely proud of the girls studying at IIMPACT centres and that they were doing so well. He also mentioned that in his own family, his son (who is educated upto class 12) was facing economic hardships as his wife was uneducated and therefore unable to contribute to the household income. The Pradhan decided that she would now be enrolled at the IIMPACT Learning Centre. The elders blessed Mrs Tandon and Ms Kripalani and immediately pointed out the location where the community would build a permanent structure for an IIMPACT centre.

BHUTERI – A GIRL WITH HIGH ASPIRATIONS

Bhuteri is a resident of Bandipura village in Rajasthan. She belongs to a very poor family and has the distinction of being IIMPACT's oldest student, having graduated from class V in 2005. She is now pursuing her studies in a local secondary school. Bhuteri's father, Kanhaiya Lal works as a mason and her mother, Gulab Devi, is the treasurer of the Women's Education Committee of the village. She claims that it is thanks to IIMPACT that her daughter has reached so far as otherwise she would not have had access to any education.

Bhuteri has five sisters and one brother who has studied upto class 12. Currently her sister Sona is also studying at IIMPACT and completed her class V exam with flying colours this year. Bhuteri is full of dreams and has high aspirations for herself. She is keen to continue with her education and would like to work in the city one day. All of us at IIMPACT are proud of Bhuteri and will stand by her, helping her on her way. We wish her all the best and are sure she will make a mark in whatever she chooses to pursue.



OUR VERY SPECIAL DONORS - CHILDREN OF DIEGUENO COUNTRY SCHOOL, USA



In one corner of the classroom you can glimpse an eye catching photograph of all the students from Diegueno Country School which was sent specially for them. Though this centre is located in a poor village of Mewat, Haryana we managed to successfully create an environment which is similar to that of private schools in cities . This could not have been possible without the help of the village community and the local staff. Classes at this centre were formally started in February 2009. Most of the girls enrolled here have previously never been to school. Thanks to the children of Diegueno Country School, Ms Sushma Patel and Ms Jas Grewal (both of whom helped this unique relationship take off), these girls have been introduced to IIMPACT's method of joyful learning.

This is first time that we have had young school children voluntarily come together to donate towards the education those less privileged than themselves. The young children of Diegueno Country School obviously appreciate the need and importance of education in every child's life. Everyone at IIMPACT was very moved by the act of the children of Diegueno Country School of contributing collectively to support one Learning Centre. It was unanimously decided to put in concerted efforts to make the Diegueno Country School supported learning center unique in every way. An abandoned thatched roof house was selected in Mewat, Haryana to serve as the classroom. It can now be seen beautifully decorated with vibrant colors and paintings created by our young girls.

EVENTS-THE YEAR GONE BY

CELEBRATING THE SUCCESS OF THE GIRLS BY THE BANDIPURA COMMUNITY

Five years ago people of Bandipura village would never have imagined that they would come together to celebrate the academic success of their girl children. Infact it was rather difficult for IIMPACT to garner their support during the initial phase of its project there.

Five years hence, Meenu, a girl from Bandipura is the local class V board examination topper, scoring 93.14% (2008). A total of 94 girls from IIMPACT centres in Rajasthan appeared for this exam.

The proud village elders of Bandipura decided to celebrate and honour all 94 girls. The village education committee took on the responsibility of organizing this big event. Everyone in the village contributed to the grain bank set up for the purpose of hosting lunch for 400 girls from IIMPACT centres and 300 adults from various blocks of Alwar. On July 8th 2008 – a spacious tent was set up to accommodate 1000 people along with a big stage for cultural performances. Colorful cultural performances took place followed by the certificate and prize



distribution ceremony. The committed teachers and the students were congratulated for their hard work.

VILLAGE EDUCATION COMMITTEE MEETINGS

The participation of community members and parents in the village education committee meetings across our Learning Centres was very encouraging. These meetings take place once a month at all our centres. Various issues of importance were discussed.

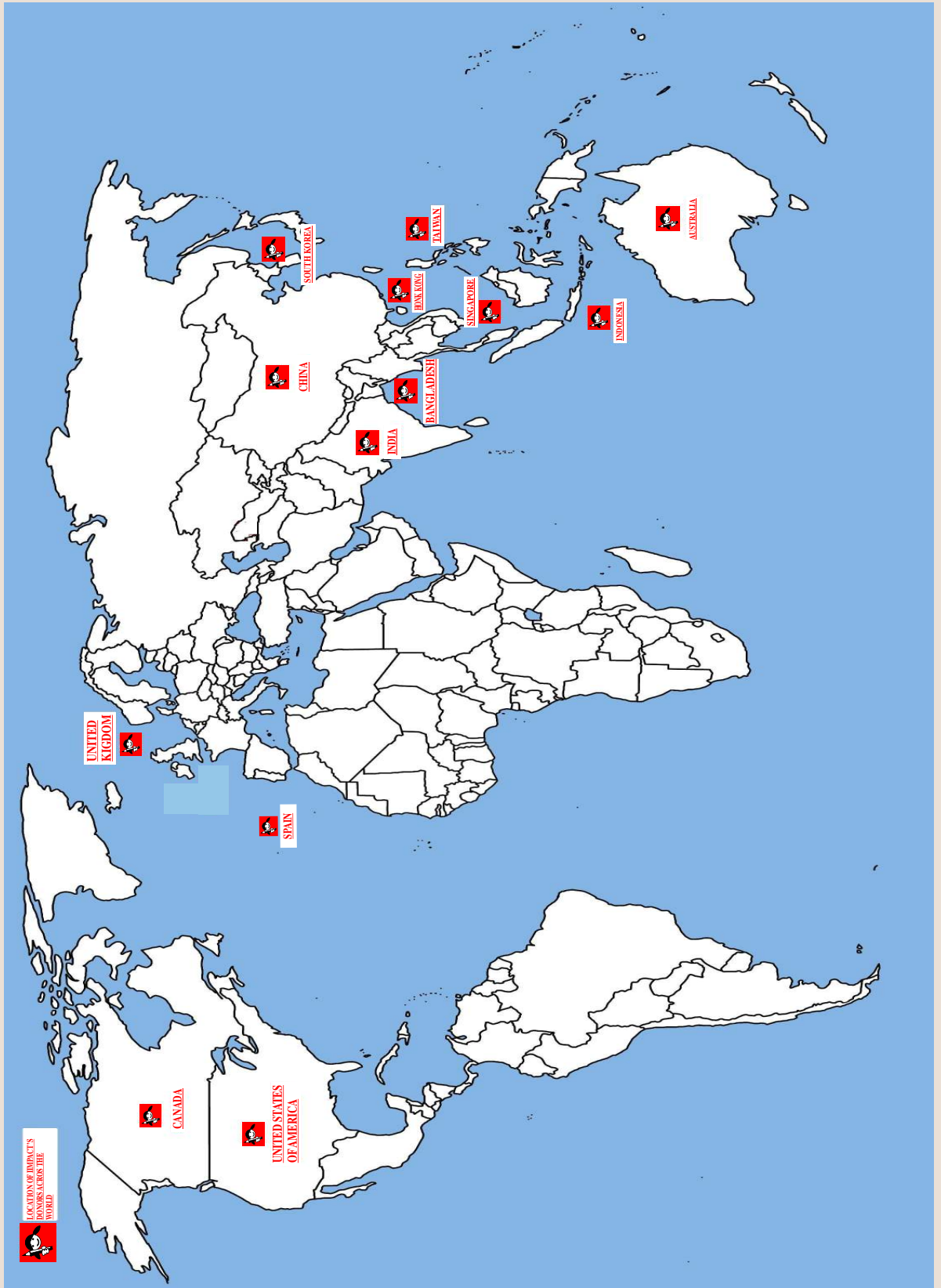
