few relevant words on Primary Education fron r.D.Subbarao, Governor of Reserve Bank of India

'The three critical facets of primary education are enrolment, retention and minimum levels of achievements. Allocating resources is only the first step; necessary, but not sufficient to achieve the above objectives. We need to complement this supply side response with interventions to raise the demand for education and improve its quality. The major thrust for this will have to come through essentially non-cash inputs. We have to convince illiterate parents that the benefits of sending their children to school are higher than the opportunity costs.

OPENING OF NEW CENTERS

SARD (Society for All Round Development) is a non-profit organization aiming at increasing the participation of minorities and disadvantaged communities in mainstream development processes.

Mewat is a culturally contiguous region located 64 kms southwest of Delhi. The entire Mewat region is situated in and around the Aravali range of mountains. Access for education in Mewat has been a major problem, especially for girls. The abysmally poor female literacy rate here ranges from 1.76% to 2.13% being the lowest in the country.

IIMPACT's girl child education program in partnership with SARD in Mewat, Haryana was inaugurated in September this year. 12 centres across 12 villages have already been established and an additional 8centres will be operational from January 2009.


VISITORS TO IIMPACT CENTRES
