

IIMPACT GIRLS SHINE ONCE AGAIN!



Their confidence levels are soaring! After completing 4 years with IIMPACT's education program our girls have proved once again this year that they can successfully compete in the outside world. Every year our class V girls work hard as they prepare to appear in the local Rajasthan Govt Class V Board exams before being eased into the local secondary level formal schools. This year a total of 167 girls appeared for this external examination out of which 149 girls scored first division, 14 girls scored a second division and only 4 scored a third.

With books as their constant companions, the very girls who had never dreamt of going to school can now look forward to taking on the world with the learning and skills that they have acquired at the IIMPACT Learning Centres.

TRAINING WORKSHOPS

FOUNDATION TRAINING

Foundation Training for teachers was organized at Mehmoodabad from 4th to 8th May 2009.



CURRICULUM TRAINING WORKSHOP AT ALWAR

A one day training programme on curriculum development was organized for 50 teachers from Alwar on 19th June 2009. The training programme was conducted by Mr. Mukul Sahgal, IIMPACT's consultant for curriculum development. The training programme was conducted at Alwar.

TRAINING ON SCIENTIFIC MODELS

A one day training workshop on Scientific Models was conducted for teachers on 15th February at Raichur, Karnataka and on 23rd June 2009, at Nogawan, Rajasthan.

CHILDREN'S CAMP AT RAICHUR

A learning level camp was organized for children at different educational levels in 5 batches. A total of 146 children attended the camp from 9 centres. The camp was conducted for 3 days. Children learned the Kannada alphabet in a play way method. At the end of the camp the teachers evaluated the children who scored fairly well.




MONITORING VISIT

VISIT TO RAICHUR

A team from IIMPACT visited Raichur in February. The highlight was the opportunity to interact with around 30 children who were attending a 3 day entry level camp. The girls enthusiastically came forward to recite poems which they had learnt at the camp. The girls enjoyed the luxury of not having to do household chores while attending this camp.

IIMPACT'S INITIATIVE FOR MEANINGFUL BOOKS

At IIMPACT every child gets a set of Language, Maths, English and EVS books. These books are typically published and procured locally making it difficult for us to maintain uniformity in curriculum across all hubs.

Mr. Mukul Sahgal, Publisher, Orient Blackswan Pvt. Limited stepped in to offer us his expertise. As we are working in 5 different states, we have a rich collection of different styles of books used. Mr. Sehgal has suggested ways to standardize book content across IIMPACT centres. This will enable us to develop even more meaningful and attractive teaching learning materials.



IIMPACT'S NEW INITIATIVE IN JAIPUR

IIMPACT is introducing new Learning Centres in the Raisar Block of Jamwa Ramgarh Tehsil, situated 30 kms from Jaipur. Here IIMPACT will educate over 600 girls in remote village areas where even water is a scarcity.

IIMPACT will work in the area with SARD. Survey work has been completed in 30 villages & findings suggest that 20 Learning Centres can easily be started across 15 villages. These survey findings have been verified, meetings with local village communities have been conducted and spaces for the Learning Centres have been identified. The centres will soon be operational.


PAN IIM GOLF TOURNAMENT-MARCH 2009 - GOLDEN GREENS GOLF RESORT, GURGAON
