The words of Mr Duru, Head of the Village Council of Mahua Khurd "When IIMPACT came to our village with an offer to educate our daughters we feared that our girls would be negatively influenced and we insisted on inspecting the academic content. However, today as I speak on this function I thank IIMPACT for positively influencing our village culture. Now, we have not one but two IIMPACT learning centres running here. I assure you all that I will take responsibility for the girls to study and make us proud parents." This community is now keen for IIMPACT to expand within their geographies.

IIMPACTFUL INITIATIVES

SCIENCE ON WHEELS-Mehmoodabad, U.P.

IIMPACT believes that the best form of learning is by doing and experiencing.

IIMPACT'S Science on Wheels project at the Mehmoodabad centres has succeeded in inculcating basic knowledge of science and environment in the children and thus arouse their curiosity and interest for further explorative education.

COMPUTER AIDED LEARNING- Alwar, Rajasthan

The Computer Learning Programme in the Alwar Learning Centres is running well. The girls have now gained a basic awareness about computers and are able to perform simple applications with ease. Daily classes run for 30 minutes to an hour.

 TEACHER'S TRAINING at various hubs such as Jaipur, Shravasti, Mehmoodabad and Gajapati

The main objective of the training programme was to introduce the use and development of new teaching learning material, innovative pedagogical practices, and subject specific training.

• SUPERVISOR AND TEACHERS TRAINED ON DEVELOPMENT OF SLM

Residential training programmes were organized for the teachers of different classes in four phases and the main focus of the exercise was the development of Self- Learning Material (SLM).

• REFRESHER TRAINING PROGRAM AND TLM WORKSHOP IN MEWAT

The focus of the training was to instill basic teaching methods, usage of TLM and prepare the teachers for the challenges and capacity building for effective teaching. A Teaching Learning Material (TLM) development workshop was also organized.

• FOUNDATION TRAINING IN MAYURBHANJ, ORISSA

These workshops help ensure that our teachers and supervisors remain well informed and updated as their skills are constantly being upgraded through well

MANISHA-A DETERMINED YOUNG GIRL!

Manisha belongs to a very poor and largely illiterate family. Her 35 year old father Jagdish has studied upto class 5 and her mother Gholi Devi is completely illiterate. Eight year old Manisha herself had never previously been to school until the IIMPACT learning centre was established in the vicinity. Manisha's father works as a farmer on his own small piece of land. Manisha has been going to the IIMPACT learning centre every working day, covering a distance of approximately 2 kms on foot. She really enjoys studying and is very enthusiastic about her academics. Her determination to go to school is not effected by the large water canal located in a hilly area between her village and the learning centre. On rainy days the water

level in this canal is waist deep! Despite this obvious potential deterrent Manisha did not miss even a single day of school during the monsoons last year. At times she would be forced to wade through the waist deep water in order to get to school—but that did not stop the determined Manisha.

At the Learning Centre Manisha proves to be an 'ideal student'. The daily work that is completed in the centre is revised by Manisha on regular basis. This is highly unusual for girls in the village as they normally have to deal with housework within their homes once they return from the centres. However, Manisha is such an eager student that her teacher Chiranjiv Singh has to make sure that she is given some homework daily.
